Vertical Over-21 are NOT eligible to participate as a member in any club sponsored golf tournaments. They may play as a guest in the Founders' Cup and Member-Guest 4-Ball

Weekly Quota/TOC is the season long event that ends with the Tournament of Champions.

If we exceed the maximum amount of players for any event, we will use a right of refusal to determine who will able to play. Then eligibility to be determined according to Point System within Rights of Refusal:

Second Right of Refusal: Subscription Golf
Third Right of Refusal: Under 40 Categories,

Point System for Participating in Four-Ball Tournaments:

In order to determine who will be permitted to play in the Member/Member and Member/Guest Four-Ball Tournaments in the event that there are too many applicants, a "point" system is hereby created.

A member shall receive one point for each year he has been a stockholder of the club and one point for each year the member has participated in the tournament in question. For Stockholders who leave the club or take a leave of absence, two points shall be deducted for each year of said absence however, in no case shall the leaving Stockholder's points total be less than zero.

The following shall be the order for selecting participants: (Note: Only participants who have submitted an application for entry into the tournament prior to the entry deadline shall be considered as a participant.)

- (i) Stockholders by total number of points. Ties shall be broken in the following manner. (a) Length of time as a stockholder; (b) Length of time as a member; (c) earliest membership application date; (d) Lottery.
- (ii) Members who are on the stockholder purchase plan by total number of points. In order to qualify in the category, a member must have commenced payment toward his stock purchase at least three months prior to the tournaments in question and must be current with his payments. Ties shall be broken in the following manner: (a) who has paid the most toward the purchase of the stock as of deadline date for entering the tournament in question; (b) length of time as a member; (c) earliest membership application date; (d) lottery.
- (iii) Other golfing members by total number of points—time as a golfing member and participation in tournament. Ties shall be broken in the following manner: (a) Length of time as a member; (b) earliest membership application date; (c) Lottery

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. PLAYING TIMES

1.1 General Playing Times:

All playing times are subject to the following general rules that apply to all categories of members:

First tee time on Non-Outing Mondays — 8:00 a.m.

First tee time on Outing Mondays – Closed Before Outings

First tee time on Tuesday through Friday — 8:00 a.m.

First tee time on weekends and holidays — 7:00 a.m.

1.2 Prime Time Playing Times:

- (a) Wednesday and Friday 12:00 p.m. to 2:00 p.m.
- (b) Saturday, Sunday and Holidays 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m.

1.3 No Practicing on the Golf Course:

Practicing is not permitted on the golf course. A player should not hit an extra ball if they do not like the result of their first shot, unless first ball is lost.

1.4 Booking Tee Times:

(a) Stockholder — 14 Day Advance Booking

Subscribing Golf — 10 Day Advance Booking

Golf Memberships — 40 and under — 7 Day Advance Booking

(Golf Memberships include Intermediate & Young Incentive)

Non-Resident — 7 Day Advance Booking

Pure Golf — 7 Day Advance Booking

Corporate Golf - 5 Day Advance Booking

Social Golf — 4 Day Advance Booking

Social Membership — 2 Day Advance Booking

Vertical Memberships — 2 Day Advance Bookings

- (b) It is expected that when reserving a tee time, the member will in fact have consulted with the other members of the group to ensure that they will be playing in that group. It is not proper for an individual to give names where he/she has not confirmed that the other players are available. The Pro Shop will be required to advise the Golf Committee any time a substitute is used and abuses will be dealt with by the Golf Committee.
- (c) One person cannot make more than one tee time for any four-hour period. For example, a member may reserve a tee time for 8:00 a.m. and then reserve a tee time for 2:00 p.m. for the same day.
- (d) A stockholder can book a tee time with one or more vertical immediate family members before the 2-day booking period by listing that immediate family member as a "Guest" and paying a reduced guest fee of \$60 (which includes the cart fee). [Note: Your bill will reflect the full guest fee with an offsetting credit which will result in a net fee of \$60.] For the purposes of this section, an immediate family member is defined as a child, grandchild, parent or grandparent. This booking process for an immediate family member can only be used twice per month. The Golf Committee/Board of Directors reserves the right to modify this rule during the golf season.

2. VERTICAL MEMBERS

- **2.1** There will be no greens fee for the first 20 rounds of golf each year.
- **2.2** After the 20th round, vertical members will be charged a greens fee of \$25.00 for 18 holes and \$13.00 for 9 holes.
- **2.3** Vertical members who play 4 rounds or less in a year are only allowed to use the practice facilities 1 hour before their scheduled tee time.
- **2.4** A vertical member who plays more than 4 rounds in a year will be charged a Bag Room Storage and Range fee \$300.00 for 2025.
- 2.5 Vertical members over 21 years of age are NOT eligible to participate as a member in any club sponsored golf tournaments. They may play as a guest in the Founder's Cup and Member-Guest Four-Ball.

3. GUESTS

3.1 Greens Fees:

These fees include the guest's cart fee.

These fees are subject to change at the discretion of the Board.

3.2 Reciprocals:

Members from other clubs receiving reciprocals on weekends and holidays may not tee off until after 11:00 a.m.

3.3 Number of Guests:

A member may have a maximum of three guests at one time (except during Prime Time—see 1.2), which will make up one playing foursome. During Prime Time, a foursome may only have a maximum of two guests. Exception may be granted through the Board of Directors or the Golf Professional prior to play. A member who books a tee time for a guest who fails to appear will be charged a guest fee on the second such occurrence.

3.4 Guests of Board Members:

Guests must be accompanied by a Board member to receive free play. Limit will be six guests per season.

3.5 Past Presidents' Guests:

Guests must be accompanied by a Past President to reserve free play. Limit will be six guests per season.

3.6 Registration:

Members are responsible to have their guests register with the Pro Shop.

3.7 Limitation of Play:

No one is allowed to be a guest more than twice per month.

3.8 Responsibilities of Members:

- (a) It is the responsibility of a member to inform his/ her guests of the rules and regulations of the golf course.
- (b) (b) A member is responsible for all the actions of his/her guests including, but not limited to, damage to the course or Club facilities caused by the guest.

4. CARTS AND CADDIES

4.1 Cart Fees:

\$25.00 18 holes per player

\$13.00 9 holes per player

4.2 Examining Carts:

It is the members responsibility that the cart be examined before accepting it for his/her use as the member could be held responsible for any damage sustained while in his/her possession.

4.3 Drivers Permit/License:

A person must have a state motor vehicle permit and/or drivers license and be 16 years old or more in order to drive a golf cart.

4.4 Number of Riders:

No more than two persons (including children) may ride in a cart. Everyone must be seated.

4.5 Carts are Prohibited in Parking Lot

4.6 Partial Rounds:

If inclement weather occurs, members will be charged the cart fee for nine holes if they play at least four holes of golf.

4.7 GPS Screens:

Members who turn off a golf cart's GPS screen or change any settings on the GPS screen shall be subject to suspension or termination by the Board.

4.8 Mandatory Use:

All members may use an Alpine pull cart with fee or carry their bags on the following days and times:

Monday, Tuesday and Thursday—any time

Wednesday and Friday-- before 10:00am and after 4:00pm

Saturday, Sunday and Holidays-- after 2:00pm.

If a member prefers to walk outside of these times a golf cart fee must be paid.

4.9 Abuse:

The use of carts by members and their guests is a privilege extended for their comfort and convenience. The member will be held responsible for any abuse.

4.10 Cart Etiquette:

- Asphalt paths should be used whenever possible.
- When crossing regular roads, stop and then proceed slowly.
- Never drive close to greens or traps. (No carts are allowed closer than 60 feet of the green.)
- Never park in front of the green.
- Do not drag your feet outside the cart or get in or out of the cart while it is moving.

5. PRIORITY ON THE COURSE

5.1 Registration:

All golfers must register at the Pro Shop before commencing play and must obtain permission from the Pro Shop before starting anywhere but the first tee.

5.2 Starting:

The Pro and his/her staff have the complete authority as starters on the first and tenth tees. No player may start on the back nine without their permission.

5.3 Foursome:

Playing groups of more than four are not permitted except in the discretion of the Pro.

5.4 Cutting:

Cutting over from one hole to another is not permitted.

5.5 Single Players:

A single player has no standing and should give way to a match of any kind.

6. LEAGUES

6.1 Twilight League:

The Twilight League will play on Thursdays. All carts must be off the golf course by 4PM (no exceptions).

7. RECIPROCALS

7.1 In General:

The Alpine Country Club maintains reciprocal playing privilege agreements with several area country clubs. Reciprocal agreements are established and maintained by PGA Head Professionals at respective clubs and are granted as a courtesy.

7.2 When to be Utilized:

Reciprocal agreements are established to allow members playing privileges at area clubs while our club is being utilized for a club tournament that closes the course for the entire day to its members.

7.3 Booking Procedure:

All requests for reciprocal playing privileges at another participating club must be made through The Alpine Country Club's PGA Director of Golf.

7.4 Memberships:

Reciprocal privileges are available for Stockholders, Sub-Golf, Under 40 Categories and Pure Golf Members only.

7.5 Selection of Members:

Members shall be afforded reciprocal privileges based on their membership categories in the order in which they appear in Section 7.4. Stockholders will be given a 24 hour window to sign-up first. After 24 hours, the other categories eligible for reciprocals may sign up.

8. OUTSIDE PARTIES

8.1 Requests:

Outside parties wishing to use the golf facilities must make a request in writing, stating the number of golfers, etc., to the Board of Governors 30 days in advance of the desired date.

8.2 Members Right to Play:

On days of outside parties, members may play immediately after the tournament as soon as carts are available.

9. TOURNAMENTS

- **9.1** USGA Rules govern all play except for local rules as posted including, but not limited to, range/distant finders may be used.
- **9.2** These rules shall apply to all Board Tournaments, ABCD Events, Ryder Cup Qualifiers, Member Guest and One-Day Tournaments.
- **9.3** Members will be responsible for all fees if they do not cancel by the deadline date (*see "Failure to Play" below*).
- 9.4 On days of tournaments, competition and special occasions, restrictions governing play may be invoked. Rules and regulations for the day will be posted and members are requested to familiarize themselves with such regulations.

9.5 Point System for Participation in Tournaments:

In order to determine who will be permitted to play in the Member-Member and Member-Guest Tournaments in the event that there are too many applicants, a "point" system is hereby created. This point system may also be used for other tournaments at the discretion of the Tournament Committee.

A member shall receive one point for each year he has been a stockholder of the Club and one point for each year the member has participated in the tournament in question. For stockholders who leave the Club or take a leave of absence, two points shall be deducted for each year of said absence; however, in no case shall the leaving stockholders point total be less than zero.

The following shall be the order for selecting participants:

(Note: Only participants who have submitted an application for entry into the tournament prior to the entry deadline shall be considered as a participant.)

- (i) Stockholders by total number of points. Ties shall be broken in the following manner: (a) length of time as a stockholder; (b) length of time as a member; (c) earliest application date; (d) lottery.
- (ii) Members who are on the Stock Purchase Plan by total number of points. In order to qualify in this category, a member must have commenced payment toward his stock purchase at least three months prior to the tournament in question and must be current with his payments. Ties shall be broken in the following manner: (a) who has paid the most toward the purchase of the stock as of the deadline date for entering the tournament in question; (b) length of time as a member; (c) earliest application date; (d) lottery.
- (iii) Other golfing member by total number of points time as a golfing member and participation in tournament. Ties shall be broken in the following manner: (a) length of time as a member; (b) earliest application date; (c) lottery.

9.6 Policy for Injuries During Four-Ball Tournament:

In order to establish a procedure for substitutes to play in the event that a member of a team is injured, becomes ill or has a family emergency during the course of any of the Four-Ball Tournaments, the following policy is enacted. This policy is only intended to apply for injuries, illnesses or family emergencies.

If, during the course of any of the Member-Member or Member-Guest Tournaments a participant is injured, becomes ill or has a family emergency so that he is unable to compete, the following rules shall govern:

- If the injury, illness or family emergency occurs during a match, that match shall be completed and no substitution shall be allowed.
- (ii) A substitute shall be allowed for all subsequent matches provided that play will not be delayed to allow the substitute an opportunity to appear. However, the substitute will be allowed to commence play upon his arrival, even if it is in the middle of the match.
- (iii) If the injured or ill participant or participant who must leave because of a family emergency is a member, the substitute must be a member. If he is a guest, the substitute may be either a member or another guest.
- (iv) Any substitute shall be subject to the same rules as all other participants (e.g. verifiable handicap, maximum 10-stroke differential, first-time participant, etc.).
- Once a substitute has begun play, the original participant shall not be allowed to return.
- (vi) Nothing in this policy requires the use of a substitute.Play may continue with a team using only one player.

9.7 Failure to Play: Members who sign-up for a tournament are expected to participate. A member who signs up for a tournament and fails to give the Pro Shop at least 24 hours' notice prior to the start of the tournament will be charged the tournament entry fee and may be barred from participation in future tournaments. Notwithstanding the foregoing, for the Spring Member-Member, the Fall Member-Member, the Italian Festa and the four Four-Ball Tournaments, you must notify the Pro Shop in writing (e-mail is acceptable) of your intention to withdraw at least one week prior to the start of the tournament. If you notify the Pro Shop subsequent to that time, you will be charged the full entry fee unless another member fills your spot.

9.8 Tournament Weather Policy:

A. <u>Guiding Principles</u>: The following are the priorities in deciding whether to play in inclement weather:

1st Safety of the players and staff.

2nd Integrity of the golf course.

 3^{rd} Completing the tournament and/or finishing as many of the rounds of the tournament as possible.

Keeping players dry is not a priority. If the course is not playable and safe, the Tournament Committee will do its best to complete the tournament or get as much of the tournament finished as possible.

Even though all tournaments have a rain date, it is the goal of the Tournament Committee to complete the tournament "on time." This is necessary to (a) protect the integrity of the tournament (e.g. not having teams forfeit because they have no chance of winning); and (b) protect the interests of members not playing in the tournament.

B. <u>Tournament Guidelines</u>: For each tournament, the tournament chairman with the Pro and superintendent will make decisions consistent with the foregoing principles. If the tournament cannot be completed as originally scheduled, the Tournament Committee, with guidance from the Pro, shall determine the format for the balance of the tournament.

10. GOLF COURSE ATTIRE

Golf Course, Driving Range & Short Game Area Attire (At All Times)-

- 10.1 Men/boys: Slacks or shorts with belt loops and a collared golf shirt. Shirts must be tucked in at ALL times.
- **10.2** Women/girls: Golf skorts, shorts, or slacks, and a collared golf shirt or blouse.
- **10.3** Children will be held to the same dress code policy as adults.
- 10.4 Cargo pants and shorts as well as jeans, yoga pants, tee shirts, jackets with hoods, bathing suits, and tank tops are not allowed at any time.
- **10.5** Alpine is a soft spike course, no hard spikes are allowed.
- 10.6 No denim allowed at any time
- 10.7 Collared shirts are required and must be tucked in
- 10.8 Hats must be worn forward-facing at all times
- **10.9** Only appropriate golf or tennis shoes are allowed on the golf course
- 10.10 No Warm-up suits, sweat suits & Hooded Sweat Shirts
- **10.11** Shorts or skirts should not be higher than 3" above the knee
- **10.12** Those not adhering to these policies will be asked to change immediately or will be asked to leave.

11. PRACTICE FACILITIES

- 11.1 The practice facilities are under the jurisdiction of the Pro Shop and members must use the areas that are designated on that particular day. The practice facilities will be closed at the discretion of the Pro according to time and weather factors, and will remain closed for a sufficient amount of time to allow the Pro Shop staff to have an opportunity to clean and/or clear the range of balls
- 11.2 Practice facilities include the driving range, short game area and two putting greens.

11.3 Practice Facilities — Hours:

Mondays — 8:00am to 5:00pm

Tuesdays through Fridays — 7:30 a.m. to 45 minutes before sunset

Saturdays, Sundays, and Holidays — 6:30 a.m. to 45 minutes before sunset

- 11.4 Golfers must stay between the tee markers when practicing on the driving range.
- 11.5 Members are not allowed to practice on the golf course. Hitting two balls constitutes practicing. Practice in designated areas only.
- **11.6** Boys and girls under the age of 14 must be accompanied by an adult at all times.
- 11.7 Golf carts are not allowed on the driving range.
- 11.8 The practice facilities can only be used by golfing members and social golf members who have paid the annual range fee.

12. **GENERAL REGULATIONS**

12.1 Parking:

Parking in the Pro Shop area and on road along the practice range and short game area is prohibited.

12.2 Responsibility:

Each member is responsible for their action and conduct, the action and conduct of the member's guests and the supervision of the action and conduct of their caddy.

12.3 Complaints:

All complaints by members regarding violations of The Alpine Country Club Rules and Regulations must be reported to the Golf Committee in writing and signed by the person filing the complaint. Only complaints handled in this manner will be addressed.

12.4 Equipment:

No member may use another members equipment without permission. Permission to do so must be given to the Pro or his assistant and they will give out the equipment.

12.5 Safety:

When the siren for a lightning warning is sounded or when the Pro directs anyone off the course for a public safety reason, members are required to leave the golf course immediately.

12.6 Forfeiture of Privileges:

Those not adhering to these guidelines may be asked to leave the course. Any member whose membership has been suspended, forfeited for any cause, or expelled, shall not enjoy guest privileges, either golf or social.

12.7 Pace of Play:

A. Definition of "Out of Position"

The first group to start will be considered out of position if, at any time during the round, the group is behind the prescribed schedule.

Any following group will be considered out of position if it (a) is taking more than the allotted time to play and (b) reaches the teeing ground of a par-3 hole and the preceding group has cleared the next tee; reaches the teeing ground of a par-4 hole and the putting green is clear; or reaches the teeing ground of a par-5 hole when the preceding group is on the putting green. Both (a) and (b) must apply for a group to be out of position.

Never look back to determine if you are out of position—only look ahead of you.

B. Time Guidelines

When play is in groups of four (stroke or match play), groups will be required to play at no more than a 4-hour pace for the 18-hole round regardless of the groups in front of or behind your group.

C. Failure to Comply With Time Guidelines

The pace of each group will be monitored closely by a member of the professional staff with multiple different check points on the golf course. If a group is out of place, they will be given their first warning. This warning will be to inform them they are officially out of place and they need to catch up to the group in front of them. At the next check point, if they are still out of position, they will be given their second warning and told they must play ready golf. The professional staff member will stay close to that group after the second warning. If they do not start to close the gap or play at a pace that has been set and approved, they will be moved into the correct position. This may include skipping 1 or 2 holes. They will be moved on the golf course to help ensure the enjoyment for the other members and guests playing. A member who fails to comply with the directive to move into the correct position shall be summoned before the Golf Committee which may impact that member's playing privileges or may be referred to the Board which may result in a suspension or termination.

D. Helpful Hints When Using Carts

- The player furthest from the hole should be driven to his ball first. His partner should either (a) drive to his own ball or (b) leave the cart and walk toward his own ball with the club he anticipates hitting.
- After hitting a shot, do not put your club back in the bag. Drive with it to your next shot. Then put the initial club back in the bag while withdrawing the next club you need. [This only saves approximately 5 to 7 seconds per shot, but over 18 holes with 4 players, you may save up to 10 minutes per round.]

12.8 Troon Prive Benefits:

All golf members at Alpine have the privilege to play at other private clubs at a preferred Troon Prive member rate, cart and range balls included. Members are entitled to bring up to three guests that will play for the host club's guest Troon rates. Each golfer can play up to 6 rounds at any given facility in one calendar year. Rounds are subject to the host club's advance booking policy for unaccompanied guest/reciprocal play. You make a request for a tee time by going onto www.troon.com/troon-prive-member-golf, finding the course you would like to play, click on request a tee time and fill in your information for your request. Facility's and rate information are shown on that webpage.

12.9 Smoking:

It is illegal to smoke anywhere inside the clubhouse and golf shop. Smoking is only allowed on the golf course, patio, and at the pool. There is no smoking directly in front of the snack bar or under any awnings.

Call the golf shop to sign up. 12:30PM cut off in season and 11:00AM cut off in off season to sign up.

Sunday Train

Tee Times 7:30AM-8:10AM in season and 8:10AM-8:50AM off season.

Call the golf shop to sign up. 7:00AM cut off in season and 7:30AM cut off in off season to sign up.

Ladies' Trains

Formats: All different formats.

Wednesdays - Tee times start at 4:30PM for 9 holes

Weekend Games (optional)

Every Saturday, Sunday and Holiday the Golf Shop will run a team or individual game with Gross and Net Skins as well. The group must tee off before 12 p.m. to be entered into the game. A maximum of 2 guests will be allowed and must have a USGA handicap. For your score to count you MUST return a completed scorecard to the Golf Shop. Any holes that are left blank the player will receive a score of net par. Golf Shop will post all scores of players that participated in the weekend games.

Weekly Quota

For a score to count each week in the Weekly Quota you must register in the Golf Shop before your round to get specific Weekly Quota card. After you have completed your round the card MUST be turned into the Golf Shop, no exceptions. The Golf Shop will post all scores for the Weekly Quota throughout the season.
